MI Psigma Multi Asset Balanced Index Fund of Funds (“the Fund”) B Accumulation Shares

This is a sub fund of MI Psigma Multi Asset Fund of Funds. The Fund is a non-UCITS retail scheme Open Ended Investment Company. ISIN: GB00BFZNT450.
Maitland Institutional Services Ltd is the Authorised Corporate Director of the Fund.

Objectives and investment policy

The Fund aims to preserve capital and deliver returns in line with the UK Consumer Price Index plus 3% (after Psigma fees), over a seven year investment period, by investing in a range of index tracker funds.

The Fund will comprise, but not be limited to, a balanced blend of index tracker funds, which are designed to follow the performance of a particular index. The portfolio may include equity funds, bond funds, property funds, commodity funds and absolute return funds established in Europe. Overall, the Fund will have a maximum equity weighting of 60% and a maximum higher risk bonds weighting of 15%.

Bonds are like loans that pay a fixed or variable rate of interest issued by governments, companies and other large organisations worldwide.

The Fund may also invest up to 15% of its assets in alternative investment strategies in order to reduce volatility.

Any income this share class generates will be reinvested to grow the value of your investment.

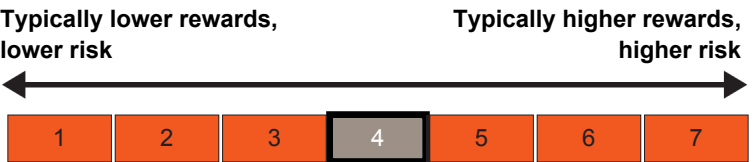
You can buy and sell shares on any business day in London.

Risk and reward profile

The Risk and Reward Indicator table demonstrates where the Fund ranks in terms of its potential risk and reward. The higher the rank the greater the potential reward but the greater the risk of losing money. It is based on past data, may change over time and may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. The shaded area in the table below shows the Fund’s ranking on the Risk and Reward Indicator.



- The Fund is ranked at 4 because funds of this type have experienced average rises and falls in value in the past. Please note that even the lowest risk class can lose you money and that extreme market circumstances can mean you suffer severe losses in all cases. The indicator does not take into account the following risks of investing in this Fund:
- Investing in other funds may expose investors to increased risk due to less strict regulations and the use of derivatives. These other funds can themselves invest into assets such as bonds, company shares, cash and currencies. 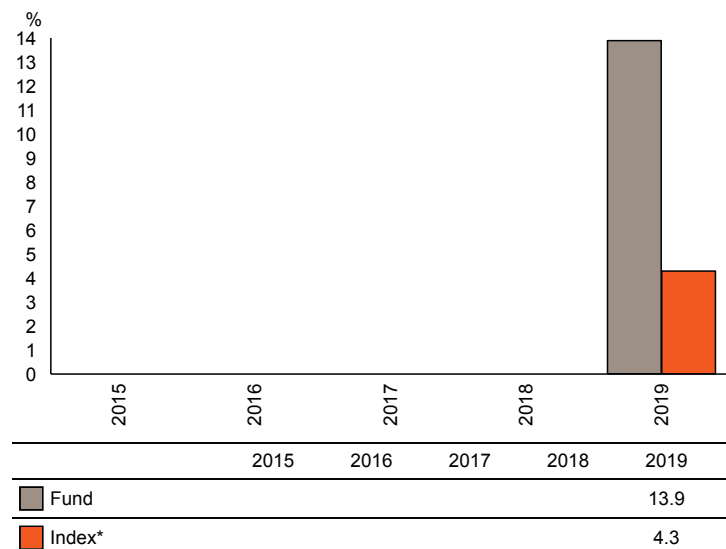
