Investment objective

The Fund aims to track as closely as possible the returns of the MSCI Brazil Index (the "Index"). The Fund will invest in or gain exposure to shares of companies which make up the Index.



Investment strategy

The Index is made up of the largest stock market listed companies in Brazil, as defined by the Index provider. The Fund will be passively managed and will aim to invest in the shares of the companies in generally the same proportion as in the Index. However, there may be circumstances when it is not possible or practical for the Fund to invest in all constituents of the Index. If the Fund cannot invest directly in the companies that constitute the Index, it may gain exposure by using other investments such as depositary receipts, derivatives or funds. The Fund may invest up to 35% of its assets in securities from a single issuer during exceptional market conditions. The Fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in total return swaps and contracts for difference. The Fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in other funds, including HSBC funds. See the Prospectus for a full description of the investment objectives and derivative usage.



Main risks

- The Fund's unit value can go up as well as down, and any capital invested in the Fund may be at risk.
- The value of investible securities can change over time due to a wide variety of factors, including but not limited to: political and economic news, government policy, changes in demographics, cultures and populations, natural or human-caused disasters etc.
- The Fund may invest in Emerging Markets, these markets are less established, and often more volatile, than developed markets and involve higher risks, particularly market, liquidity and currency risks.




