#### Objective

To generate income and some growth over the long term (5 years or more) by investing in inflation-linked bonds with a maturity of up to 10 years.


**Performance Target:** To achieve the return of the following composite index: 70% Bloomberg World Government Inflation Linked ex UK (1-10 Years) Index (Hedged to GBP) / 30% Bloomberg UK inflation-linked (1-10 Years) Index, plus 0.5% per annum (before charges). There is no certainty or promise that the Performance Target will be achieved.

The composite index defined above (the "Index") is a representative index of the global market for inflation-linked bonds with a maturity of up to 10 years.

#### Portfolio securities

- The fund will invest at least 70% in inflation-linked investment grade government bonds (which are like loans to governments that pay a variable interest rate linked to inflation and are typically regarded as having a low default risk) issued anywhere in the world with a maturity of up to 10 years.
- The fund may also invest in inflation-linked and non-inflation-linked investment grade corporate bonds (which are like loans to companies that pay interest and are typically regarded as having a low default risk) and other bonds issued anywhere in the world. The fund will employ techniques to reduce (hedge) risk related to currency movements on non-sterling bonds.
- The fund may also invest in other funds (including those managed by abrdn), cash and assets that can be turned into cash quickly.
