Fund Objective and Strategy

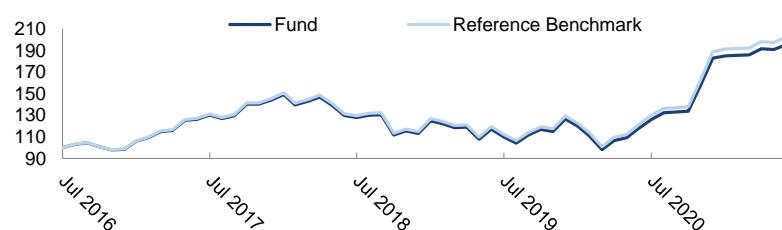
Investment Objective

The Fund aims to track as closely as possible the returns of the MSCI Korea Capped Net Index (the "Index"). The Fund will invest in or gain exposure to shares of companies which make up the Index.

Investment Policy

The Index is made up of the largest stock market listed companies in South Korea, as defined by the Index provider. The Fund will be passively managed and will aim to invest in the shares of the companies in generally the same proportion as in the Index. However, there may be circumstances when it is not possible or practical for the Fund to invest in all constituents of the Index. If the Fund cannot invest directly in the companies that constitute the Index, it may gain exposure by using other investments such as depositary receipts, derivatives or funds. The Fund may invest up to 35% of its assets in securities from a single issuer during exceptional market conditions. The Fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in total return swaps and contracts for difference. The Fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in other funds, including HSBC funds. 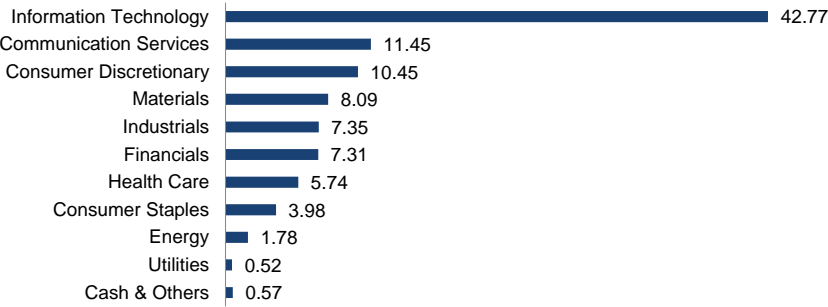

Terms of Glossary

Accumulation Share: a type of share where the income earned by the Fund is retained in the Fund

ACD: HSBC Global Asset Management (UK) Limited, the Authorised Corporate Director of the Company

Developed Markets: countries with relatively high levels of personal income and established economies

Emerging Markets (EM): countries that are progressing toward becoming advanced, usually shown by some development in financial markets, the existence of some form of stock exchange and a regulatory body

Equities: shares issued by a company

Growth: the increase in the value of investments

Income: money generated by a fund, such as interest from a bond or a dividend from a share, which can be paid out to its investors or paid back into the fund and reinvested

Income Share: the type of Share where the income earned by the Fund is paid out to you

Net Asset Value (NAV): the value of the scheme property of a fund less the liabilities of the fund

Ongoing Charges Figure: a measure of what it costs to invest in a fund. It includes the fee paid to the ACD and other operating costs

Return(s): the money made or lost on an investment

Share(s): an equally valued holding in a fund of a company, representing part ownership of that fund, (including larger denomination shares and smaller denomination shares)

Tracking Difference: the difference between the return of the fund and that of the tracking index

Tracking Error: the volatility of the difference between the return of a fund and the return of the index or indices it tracks. In general, the lower the tracking error, the more consistent a fund's performance is relative to the index, and vice-versa
