This fund is also referred to as SL Shariah CP Pension Fund.

The Fund aims to provide long-term growth by investing in one or more funds adhering to Shariah principles. These funds invest predominantly in a diversified portfolio of global equities.

The Fund may invest in both actively managed and passive index tracking funds. Where the Fund invests in more than one fund, the allocation between these funds will be re-balanced periodically.

These funds may use derivatives for the purpose of efficient portfolio management, reduction of risk or to meet their respective investment objectives (including taking short positions) where permitted and appropriate.

The value of investments within the Fund can fall as well as rise and is not guaranteed – you may get back less than you put in.

The Sterling value of overseas assets held in the Fund may rise and fall as a result of exchange rate fluctuations.

The Fund has been designed by the Trustee Directors who comprise the Defined Contribution Subcommittee (that represents the Centrica Pension Scheme, Centrica Pension Plan and Centrica Engineers Pension Schemes) in conjunction with their advisers specifically for the following scheme sections: Centrica Savings Plan, Centrica Savings Plan (2011 Section) and Centrica Engineers Savings Plan. Standard Life will continue to consult with the Trustee Directors and their advisers on the future make up of the Fund, which may be changed from time to time by Standard Life following discussion with the Trustee Directors and their advisers.
