The Fund aims to provide capital growth and income in excess of the MSCI AC World (Net Total Return) Index (after fees have been deducted) over a three to five year period by investing in equity and equity related securities of companies worldwide. The fund seeks to achieve its investment objective by investing up to 100% in the Schroder QEP Global Active Value Fund.




